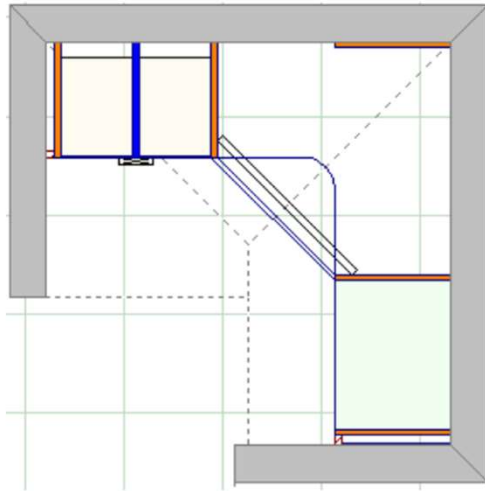


PANTRY

15"D Wall Rail System OR 16" D Tall Floor System x 84" H (Industry Standard Dimension)



- Fillers will be used in multi design walls for a cleaner install, eliminating the need for cutting materials, as the filler will be the only piece that needs modification.
- For taller ceilings you would create stackable, as the tallest single panel goes to 108" only. Your panel height increments can be structured to the following standard heights: 84", 96" and 108".
- You can accomplish 15" depth maximum with wall panels that are suspended on the rail system and if you want deeper then you can use the floor panel system at 16" deep or higher.
- Regular TFL and dovetail drawer boxes have pre-determine heights (6", 8", 9", 12") and depths (12", 14", 16", 18", 22"). Scooped dovetail boxes have their own heights (2", 3", 6", 8") and depths (12-5/8", 14-5/8", 16-5/8") but you can modify the width up to 36". Industry standard widths are 18", 24" and 30". Do not exceed overall height of 48" for drawer banks. TFL is available unassembled or assembled and dovetails are always assembled – default undermount soft-close slides at 50 lbs capacity.
- Accessories are 14"D and with standard widths of 18", 24" and 30". Accessories have side-mounted slides.

Obstructions

- Ceiling light may impact how high you can take the material.
- Baseboard heights, light switch, outlets, heating and air vents, electric panels, attic space, etc. are all items you must be mindful when taking your measurements. It is important you design around these items.
- When placing drawer boxes or slide-out accessories right next to a wall, be sure they clear door casing and baseboards and allow easy slide out. A filler may be necessary here.

Corner unit shelving is commonly used in a pantry, as the adjustable shelves allow the user to move them up and down as needed for their inventory.

When designing with wall panels that are on rails you must design at 15"D and will floor panels you must design in 16"D.

Baking sheet dividers are a great way to break up a shelving heavy design.

Drawers and baskets are great for a pantry. Keeping spices and cans inside a shallower drawer can be fully accessed with the full extension open.
